Win £500, a gold medal and a commemorative certificate plus an invitation to receive the Richard Carter Prize at the Institution Dinner to be held at the Houses of Parliament, London, on 10 October 2008.

The candidate

Nominees will have made an outstanding contribution in any of the following specialisms, either individually or through team leadership:

- Photogrammetry and Remote Sensing.
- GIS.
- Cartography/Visualisation.
- Land and Engineering Surveying.
- Hydrographic Surveying.

Candidates must have made an outstanding contribution, within two years prior to the closing date for nominations, in any of the following ways;

- Working in a senior position with the responsibility of co-ordinating all aspects of the surveying and setting-out on a major project or high-profile construction project.
- Being involved in developing new methods/techniques either specific to a particular project or within the industry.
- Contributing to academic research that will have significant impact on the future of any aspect of the geospatial engineering disciplines.
- Have made a lifetime contribution to the profession.

The Institution's Geospatial Engineering Practices Committee (GEPC) will judge the nominations.

Nomination procedures

The closing date for receipt of nominations is midday on Tuesday 1 July 2008 and the winner will be announced on Monday 1 September 2008.

THE PRIZE

The Richard Carter Prize is presented to a geospatial engineer who is judged to have made an outstanding contribution to the civil engineering surveying industry, either individually or through team leadership. This biennial award is designed to encourage applicants from all backgrounds and is not restricted solely to members of ICES. The prize will be awarded at the Houses of Parliament, London on 10 October 2008.

THE CANDIDATE

A candidate will have, within two years prior to the closing date, made an outstanding contribution in any of the following ways:

Contributed to academic research that will have a significant impact on the future of surveying.



Worked in a senior position with the responsibility for co-ordinating all aspects of surveying and/or setting-out on a major project.



Worked on a high profile construction project.



Have been involved in developing new methods/techniques.






Have made a lifetime contribution to the profession.

ELIGIBILITY

The prize is open to any person employed in any of the following specialisms:



Land and engineering surveying (preparing maps and plans to ensure that construction takes place to the dimensions and tolerances required).



Photogrammetry and remote sensing (producing an area plan from photographic images and using electromagnetic energy to obtain information about objects without touching them).

Geographic information systems — GIS (collecting and presenting geographical information).



Cartography/visualisation (creating 2D or 3D maps and plans).

CANDIDATE NOMINATIONS

A candidate must be nominated by either:



Their employer.



A corporate Member/Fellow of the Institution of Civil Engineering Surveyors or a full member of another professional organisation, as approved by the ICES.



A colleague working in a senior position in the same or similar organisation as that of the candidate.

The person nominating must complete the nomination form providing the following information concerning the nominee:

- Name
- Job title
- Areas of responsibility
- Company name
- Nature of project
- Area(s) of expertise, i.e. geospatial engineering discipline(s)
- Reason for nomination
- Candidate's curriculum vitae

CANDIDATE SELECTION CRITERIA

The Selection Panel

The selection panel is composed of senior members of the Institution who specialise in the field of geospatial engineering. The Geospatial Engineer Award selection process is organised by the Institution's Geospatial Engineering Practices Committee (GEPC).

The Selection Criteria

The selection panel will judge the nominations based on the following criteria:

- (a) The nature of the work, i.e. practical project, research or academic.
- (b) The candidate's personal contribution to the work i.e. technical innovation, general management, project planning and academic research.
- (c) The value of the candidate's contribution to the project and/or the profession.

PRESENTATION OF THE AWARD

All nominees will be notified in writing by the Institution concerning the outcome of their nomination.

The winning candidate will be notified by the Institution by Friday 29 August 2008 and an official announcement will be made on Monday 1 September 2008 on the Institution's website and in the members newsletter.

The award winner will be invited to receive a gold medal, a cheque for £500 and a certificate to commemorate the achievement from the Institution's president at a formal dinner to be held at the Houses of Parliament, London on Friday 10 October 2008.

Notification of this will follow in an edition of Civil Engineering Surveyor.
