The local currency is Hong Kong Dollars. For exchange rates, see <u>www.xe.com</u>. Most major credit cards are accepted almost everywhere but public transport requires cash (taxis, buses, trains, trams). The average temperature in Hong Kong in May is 24-29 °C with the humidity at 80%. Almost all public transport, hotels, offices, shopping malls etc are air-conditioned – a light jacket for gentlemen, or wrap for ladies, is recommended. Hong Kong is one of the safest places in the world but visitors should use common sense and look after their belongings at all times, especially in the more crowded tourist areas. There are several options for travelling in from the airport with the Airport Express train and taxi being the two most popular. A return ticket on the Airport Express costs HKD180 per person; a taxi fare will be higher, depending on where you are staying. The following link may be useful:
